<ul> <li>Pupils are taught to:</li> <li>listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding</li> <li>explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words</li> <li>engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others; seek clarification and help*</li> <li>speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures</li> <li>develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases*</li> <li>present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences*</li> <li>read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing</li> <li>appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language</li> <li>broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary</li> <li>write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly</li> <li>describe people, places, things and actions orally* and in writing</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In Year 6 students are equipped with important skills and foundational concepts that will allow them to flourish as they progress into the Secondary phase of their school life.</li> <li>To support children in their readiness for their local secondary school children need an understanding in the following:</li> <li>Be fluent in introducing yourself verbally and explain who is in your family</li> <li>Unit focusing on personality in French and how to use this in conversation</li> <li>Look at the grammar for using the subjunctive mood in French</li> <li>Introduction to the imperfect tense and how to write this</li> <li>Introduction to using the preceding direct object to give opinions and justify them</li> <li>Link Geography knowledge with French and discuss major cities within France and their locations</li> <li>Know what infinitive verbs are in English and in French.</li> <li>Know how to use the present tense hen writing and speaking.</li> <li>Identify irregular verbs</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Introduce yourself, introduce other people, and understand introductions from others.</li> <li>Explain who is in your family and know the French for the family nouns (mum, dad, brother etc).</li> <li>Describe the personality of yourself and family members.</li> <li>Construct comparisons in French and use them to compare</li> <li>different people's personalities.</li> <li>Describe the physical appearance of yourself and family members.</li> <li>Encounter the subjunctive mood and use it to describe</li> <li>contrasts within people's personalities.</li> <li>Explain which subjects you study at school and give justified opinions on those subjects and their teachers.</li> <li>Contrast your experience of primary school and secondary school using the imperfect tense.</li> <li>Develop opinions by including justifications and opinions using preceding direct object.</li> <li>Explain which sports you play and why, with reference to justified opinions and personality traits.</li> <li>Explain how often you play different sports, in which season you play different sports, and which sports you used to play when you were</li> </ul>

understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs; key features and patterns of the language; how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.	<ul> <li>younger.</li> <li>Explain where you and others live, giving information on type of building, landscape/settlement types, the locations of nearby cities and the points of the compass.</li> <li>Know the major cities in France.</li> <li>Give justified opinions on places, including explaining what attractions they have and what one can do there.</li> <li>Understand what infinitive verbs are in English and in French.</li> <li>Know how to conjugate regular ER, IR and RE verbs in the present tense.</li> <li>Understand the concept of irregular verbs and be able to conjugate avoir, etre, aller and faire in the present tense.</li> </ul>
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
