<ul> <li>Pupils are taught:</li> <li>about respect for self and others and the importance of responsible behaviours and actions</li> <li>about rights and responsibilities as members of families, other groups and ultimately as citizens</li> <li>about different groups and communities</li> <li>to respect equality and to be a productive member of a diverse community</li> <li>about the importance of respecting and protecting the environment</li> <li>about where money comes from, keeping it safe and the importance of managing it effectively</li> <li>how money plays an important part in people's lives</li> <li>a basic understanding of enterprise.</li> <li>how to develop and maintain a variety of healthy relationships, within a range of social/cultural contexts</li> <li>how to recognise and manage emotions within a range of relationships</li> <li>how to respond to risky or negative relationships and ask for help</li> <li>how to maintain physical, mental and emotional health and wellbeing</li> <li>how to manage risks to physical and emotional health and wellbeing</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In Year 6 students are equipped with important skills and foundational concepts that will allow them to flourish as they progress into the Secondary phase of their school life.</li> <li>To support children in their readiness for their local secondary school children need an understanding in the following:</li> <li>Draw on learning of Monarchs, democracy and apply this to learning around the political system</li> <li>Look at voting systems and political parties – link this with British values learning and school council systems</li> <li>Know what the Precious Liberties are and the historical con- text within which they have been fought for, won, defended and extended.</li> <li>Unit focusing on Legal Eagles which teaches children about the legal system, the role of police and the court system</li> <li>Unit on healthy living and how to keep themselves healthy – link with DT and food and nutrition – cooking skills</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>the development of the political system of democratic government in the United Kingdom, including the roles of citizens, Parliament and the monarch</li> <li>the operation of Parliament, including voting and elections, and the role of political parties</li> <li>the precious liberties enjoyed by the citizens of the United Kingdom</li> <li>the nature of rules and laws and the justice system, including the role of the police and the operation of courts and tribunals</li> <li>develop character, including honesty, adaptability and their courage</li> <li>Provision for teaching them how to keep physically and mentally healthy (see our RSE Policy for further information on the specifics of our Relationships and Sex Education programme)</li> <li>Preparation for life beyond school by teaching them to be reflective and responsible pupils, family members and citizens*</li> <li>Developing their understanding of our values as a school, the fundamental British values and alongside this an understanding and appreciation of diversity</li> </ul>
